### LINCOLN COUNTY HOSPITAL CELEBRATES 2011 THE YEAR OF RADIOTHERAPY

If you want to know more about how radiation is used to treat Cancer, Therapeutic Radiographers in the Radiotherapy Department at Lincoln County Hospital are holding an open day on **Saturday, 10 December 2011**. Everyone is welcome to come and see what we do and ask questions.

Many people don't know what a Radiographer does. If you have an accident and go to hospital, the chances are that you will see a Diagnostic Radiographer, who produce images that are used to diagnose injury or disease. However, Therapy Radiographers use precisely targeted doses of radiation to treat cancer.

To celebrate the Year of Radiotherapy, there will be displays and information for visitors to look at in our main waiting room. Staff will be on hand to answer questions about Radiotherapy and enquiries regarding Radiotherapy as a possible career choice. We will be running tours of the department so that visitors can see treatment machines and equipment in action. Refreshments will be available. The Radiotherapy Department will be open to visitors who want to find out more from **9.30 am until 12.30 pm**.
