A Learning Experience Like No Other

Set in Lincoln's Historic Quarter, our Preparatory and Senior School sites are fully equipped to prepare our pupils for the careers of tomorrow, providing pupils with an inspiring environment in which to fulfil their potential.

The Preparatory School, a short walk from Lincoln's historic Bailgate, has been extensively redeveloped and was opened in September 2014.

Our Senior School site occupies a number of buildings, both new and old. The purpose-built Prior Building was opened in 2002 by the former Archbishop of Canterbury, Lord Carey. The sweeping, curved, building overlooks the City and boasts fully-equipped science labs, art studios, IT suites and our dedicated Sixth Form Centre.

Our latest addition, the Harper Building, is dedicated to music and performance and includes an impressive Recital Hall, music practise rooms and a fully equipped Drama Studio. Connected to our Harper Building is a large Sports

Hall and Fitness Suite, which hosts a range of industry-leading equipment and technology.

The sight of our pupils in their distinctive blazers and staff in their academic gowns processing to the Lincoln Cathedral for our services and ceremonies, is a special one; a reminder of how important a sense of tradition is in a modern world and a modern school.

The Lincoln Minster School experience provides an enriched education that consistently creates high achievers with purpose, ambition and character. The small class sizes allow us to give each student the attention and individualised nurturing needed to support their development as they reach their full potential.

Our students and parents have the opportunity to curate their learning experience, with the option to take advantage of our 150 co-curricular clubs, our excellent sports and music facilities, our peripatetic music specialists or life changing, character forming overseas travel opportunities.

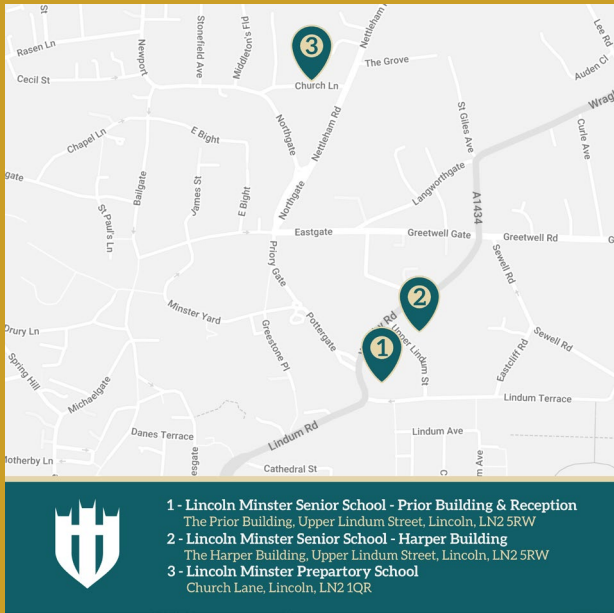
Outdoor learning is incorporated into the school curriculum. The beautiful outdoor learning area is an extension of the classroom where learning is enhanced.

SENIOR SCHOOL – YEAR 7 TO SIXTH FORM

At the Senior School, we specialise in finding the best in every pupil and place equal value on cultural, technological, scientific, linguistic and creative subjects.

Personal, Social and Health Education (PSHE) is also an important part of the KS3 curriculum. A team of skilled staff members teach lessons on health and social wellbeing, citizenship, careers and financial awareness across the School and teaching is often supported by visiting speakers.

We are constantly working to add value to and enhance the education we provide and technology has always played an important role in this. We have introduced iPad technology into our teaching and learning to provide one-to-one learning using mobile devices in the classroom, with each pupil in our Senior School having their own device.



Our History

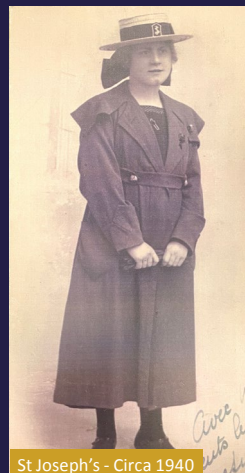

As well as stunning listed architecture, our heritage also provides the School with a strong foundation within the City and the Lincolnshire community; allowing us to be one of the most notable schools in the county and for centuries being a producer of exceptionally talented and successful alumni. Many traditions practiced in our heritage are still in motion today, including our end of term Cathedral Service. Our heritage also brings us centuries of best practise, knowledge and wisdom to build upon.

The Lincoln Cathedral, one of the finest pieces of gothic architecture in the world and situated in the heart of the county, is proudly depicted in our crest and sits beside Lincoln Minster School looking over the City in the idyllic setting of Lincoln's historic quarter. Our close connection with Lincoln Cathedral is like no other school in the City or County.

Lincoln Minster School students and their parents benefit from enhanced learning and enrichment opportunities through our partnership with the iconic Lincolnshire landmark, including our regular assemblies, graduation ceremonies and hosting theatre and musical performances. Lincoln Minster School has a long history of educating the Cathedral Choristers and our talented students are still frequently selected to sing with the world-famous choir to this day.

ART

Art facilities throughout the School are truly outstanding. From the dedicated and well-equipped studio at our Preparatory School to our Senior School Art Studio in the light-filled top floor of the Prior Building, overlooking the City, complete with Graphic Design Lab and Photography Studio.

Our students have gone on to earn prestigious awards for their artwork and have forged successful careers in the world of art and design, with alumni including contracted artworkers, architects and jewellery makers (Tiffany & Co).

DRAMA

We believe that the Performing Arts can help individuals to build confidence and to develop character. From Shakespeare to nativities, school plays to smaller performance pieces, our pupils are eager to express themselves. We also offer the London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts (LAMDA) programme and pupils from as young as Year 1 are regularly entered for examination in Verse and Prose, Acting and Devised Performance.

The Harper Building is home to our Senior School Drama Studio which is a beautifully versatile space. This professionally-equipped studio allows pupils to explore multiple elements of theatre, including lighting, stage management and set design.

MUSIC

Music is a key component of the School's curriculum throughout all year groups. Whether it's the Year 5/6 orchestra, strings ensemble, jazz band or Preparatory choir, our pupils are encouraged to fully involve themselves.

Our Harper Building benefits from individual practise rooms, classrooms and a purpose-built Recital Hall - the ideal venue for concerts, performance rehearsals and workshops. We also hold memorable concerts throughout the year in the nave of Lincoln Cathedral.



Our relationship with the Lincoln Cathedral brings with it one of the grandest of settings in which our music students can perform.

Each year, we hold our musical concerts in the Lincoln Cathedral, including piano, solo vocalists, choirs, string groupings and orchestras. Lincoln Minster School also has a long history of providing education to the Choristers, a prestigious position held by many Lincoln Minster School students and graduates.

Our modern facilities provide a stunning and purpose-built home for our student artists, including our large Recital Hall and Art Studio – providing inspiration via spectacular views across the City.

Students can benefit from well-connected tutors, regular engagement opportunities with local, national and global competitions and festivals, and one-to-one tutoring with 13 specialist peripatetic music tutors.

Our students have gone on to join conservatoires and other success in the arts industries. Graduates include: Oliver Butterworth (Royal Academy of Music, received the Regency Award for Outstanding Achievement), Beth Jerem (Royal Conservatoire of Music Glasgow, Opera Scotland, conductor and pianist) and Laura Curtis (composer/songwriter, Broadway/ musical theatre).

SPORTS

Sport and physical education are an important part of school life

A wide range of activities are available for both talented individuals who have particular interests and also for those whose motivation is more recreational and social. We firmly believe that sport is for everyone and aim to ensure that pupils of all abilities and aptitudes have a positive experience and learn to appreciate the enjoyment and benefits to be gained from physical activity.

Pupils begin competing in fixtures from Year 3 onwards and our Preparatory School has enjoyed a consistent record of success in cross-country, netball, hockey and rugby.

At Senior School, our pupils enjoy local, regional and national sporting success in many disciplines including cross-country, tennis, squash, cricket, hockey, rugby, football and netball.

Sport at the School is complemented by the wide range of co-curricular clubs and activities on offer. Pupils at the Senior School can, for example, become involved with sailing, golf, polo and a range of outdoor pursuits, including the Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

Our Sports Hall at the Senior School provides excellent indoor facilities, complete with indoor cricket nets. The Preparatory School has a generously-sized field and a hard-play area and also benefits from the use of the nearby Lindum Sports Ground. The Lindum is a short walk from the School, where we have squash courts, an all-weather hockey pitch, cricket squares and a rugby and football pitch. We also have use of tennis courts at nearby Eastgate Tennis Club and make ever-increasing use of sailing facilities on the outskirts of Lincoln.

Our Sports department has strong connections with local and national sporting teams and clubs, including: Lincoln City FC, Lincolnshire County Cricket and Loughborough Lightning.

Many of our students go on to lead a successful career in sport, including: Emma Sanders (BBC Sports Journalist), Elizabeth Simmonds (world-class athlete), Ross Brooks (West Ham Academy Coach), Poppy Miller (Sports TV Host) and Ryan Olowofela (England National Rugby Sevens Player); many of which return as Sports Ambassadors to deliver workshops and share their skills.



BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

Broadening horizons with exciting co-curricular opportunities

We believe that a rich and varied education reaches beyond the classroom and are proud to offer a wide range of co-curricular trips and visits programme for our pupils.

We encourage all pupils to take advantage of the activities that are available to them during their time with us, leaving Lincoln Minster School not only with successful grades but also with the attributes, outlook and experiences that will equip them for life.

CO-CURRICULAR CLUBS

At Lincoln Minster School, we offer a huge variety of over 150 co-curricular clubs and activities. These vary from sports, such as Cricket and Polo, to Robotics and Drama club. A number of these clubs run within the School day during enrichment periods.

HOLIDAY CLUB

Delivered during the School holidays by dedicated, enthusiastic and qualified staff, Holiday Club is a carefully planned combination of both activity days at School and trips away, often centred around a fun and interactive theme.

Pupils enjoy exciting activities and new opportunities in a safe and friendly atmosphere, with the familiar faces of the Lincoln Minster School staff.

TRIPS AND VISITS

Pupils have the opportunity to experience a wide array of trips throughout their time at the School. From cultural day trips to short-haul sports tours and long-haul ski or adventure trips, we offer an exciting range of activities.



PASTORAL CARE

The welfare and wellbeing of our students is paramount

We are recognised for the excellent pastoral care we provide to pupils who enjoy a warm and caring school community. We truly value and support each other, encouraging our pupils to embrace their unique strengths and potential.

Our exceptional standard of pastoral care ensures that every pupil has the confidence to contribute and succeed at every stage of their school life.

Pupils are supported by our pastoral lead, Heads of Key Stages 3, 4 and 5, from tutors, and Mrs Joyce, our school Nurse. Additionally, the Pastoral team is supported by two counsellors and external agencies as necessary and appropriate.

Each of our pupils are encouraged and supported to achieve their academic and social potential with personal, vocational and academic guidance along the way. Pupils are supported in building the self-confidence required to face their academic and personal challenges, both during and following their time at the School and are also

encouraged to exercise individual and social responsibility.

Our pastoral curriculum encourages the development of these skills through PSHE lessons, visits from external speakers, involvement in national anti-bullying and mental health campaigns as well as the opportunity to join and lead our pupil social action and wellbeing groups. As a result, pupils are afforded opportunities to develop and exercise important life skills.

SIXTH FORM AGES 16-18

Sixth Form study in an exciting, dynamic learning community



Our vision is to cultivate an independent senior learning community where each pupil feels a sense of belonging; motivated and determined to make the most of every opportunity.



The exceptional quality of our pastoral care ensures that time in our Sixth Form is spent productively, whilst being successful, fulfilling and enjoyable.

Together, we work towards promoting progress through providing an enriching, engaging and challenging study programme.

OPENING UP DOORS

We regularly achieve in the region of 96% of all pupils gaining entry into their first-choice university, as well as securing places on competitive apprenticeships with companies such as Siemens, Lloyds and BAE Systems.

A-Level study is challenging but immensely rewarding. The expectation is that our pupils will become increasingly enterprising and emerge as skilled, knowledgeable and competent independent learners.

PREPARATION FOR THE FUTURE

Most pupils are entered for the highly regarded Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) in which they independently choose a topic and question to research, write up, and present. Frequently, pupils choose to focus on an area of personal interest which is directly relevant to their Higher Education subject choice and which helps demonstrate their interest and commitment as well as developing their specialist vocabulary and knowledge.

Providing a curriculum that is rich in academic rigour, breadth and variety is essential. We offer an extensive choice of A-Level courses as well as vocational options for pupils with the introduction of BTECs in Travel and Tourism, Music, CTEC Business and A-Level 3 Certificate/Diploma in Food Science and Nutrition.

We are confident that with our broad and inclusive curriculum for post-16 study, as well as specialist teachers and outstanding academic and pastoral support, we can meet the needs and requirements of each and every one of our pupils.

SIXTH FORM ENTRY

Places are offered subject to satisfactory GCSE predictions and results. Additionally, pupils will be expected to meet the specific subject entry requirements for their A-Level choices. BOARDING

Two spectacular boarding houses in the heart of Lincoln's Cathedral Quarter

Both our boarding houses are just a short walk to our school sites and are overseen by highly experienced and approachable boarding staff. We pride ourselves on making every pupils' boarding experience a happy and productive one and have a range of boarding options to suit every family. Step inside a culture where each pupil, whether termly, weekly or flexi, are all treated as equal members of our boarding family.

TERMLY BOARDING

Boarders stay with us full-time, except for School holidays when they return to their parents or named guardians.

WEEKLY BOARDING

This boarding option is available to pupils who live reasonably close to the School and prefer to return home at the weekend. This option can be a great help if home is too far away for the daily journey to be reasonable.

FLEXI BOARDING

Our most flexible boarding option can offer pupils the chance to enjoy one-off stays or regular short-term stays to suit the individual needs of the family (subject to availability).

Pupils who flexi-board may stay a set number of nights a week, or may vary their nights as they see fit, with others popping in only occasionally. Flexi boarding allows any day pupil to enjoy the facilities and companionship of our boarding houses through the experience of shared activities, to have a sleepover with friends, to solve the problem of needing to stay at school late on a particular day, or simply to assist parents who might have a short-term commitment that takes them away from home.



THE MOUNT

Boarding for Girls

The Mount Boarding House is a Victorian house designated to all the girls at Lincoln Minster School. The Mount has two communal rooms where pupils can watch TV or DVDs, play video games, board games or just relax. There is also a music room, equipped with a piano, guitars and a microphone for pupils to enjoy some music practise or to simply have fun performing together.

A well-equipped craft room ensures that there is always material available, whether it is for school homework projects, organised craft activities at the weekend, or just for when pupils are feeling creative. The prep room with Wi-Fi, desks and computers ensures there is plenty of space to do homework, with staff on-hand to provide support and encouragement.

Outside, there is a multi-purpose hard court area for sports such as tennis, netball and football, and grassed areas where pupils can play swingball, badminton, or just relax. The garden is a popular area where all pupils play together, we also have a greenhouse and garden plot for those interested in gardening.

There is always plenty to do here, with regular activities in the house and local area, including swimming, go-karting, eating out, trips to the cinema, shopping, wildlife parks and more. The School also offers a varied selection of after school sports, creative and other fun activities which pupils can get involved in.

We want pupils to be happy living here and we have a friendly team of House Assistants and current pupils who will be delighted to help new pupils settle in.



EASTGATE

Boarding for Boys

Eastgate House is the boys' boarding house at Lincoln Minster School. It is a grand Victorian house surrounded by leafy gardens and lawns, situated within close proximity to the historic Bailgate area and within easy walking distance of the modern Brayford Quay.

Eastgate House has two spacious common rooms, an impressive entrance hall and two kitchens in which boys may prepare snacks after prep time in the evenings and at weekends. With a number of single and mixed, the majority of our rooms have two or three beds. Our boarding house benefits from Wi-Fi throughout so pupils may contact family and friends at designated times.

Our pupils enjoy an exciting schedule of activities throughout the year, including trips to see the Harlem Globetrotters and cultural visits to Edinburgh and New York. Basketball is popular amongst our pupils and they play regular matches in the evenings. They also play regular fixtures against other schools and clubs.

The Old Minsterians Alumni Association

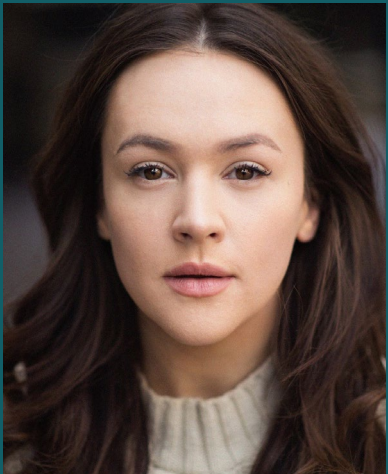
When pupils finish their studies at Lincoln Minster School they automatically become an Old Minsterian and remain part of our community for life.

Global Vision

At Lincoln Minster School, we have established strong relationships with the City’s two universities, Bishop Grosseteste University and the University of Lincoln, and we actively engage our pupils in opportunities and experiences at both.

Senior pupils can attend first year undergraduate lectures at the universities to help them understand the difference between a learning and teaching environment at school and a lecture setting at university.

Additionally, all our Sixth Form pupils are members of the University of Lincoln Library and Resources Centre, which allows them to access thousands of online and hard copy resources. This helps our pupils when researching content for their Extended Project Qualification, which our pupils commence in Year 12.

The School is an inclusive and diverse community: our pupils join us from all around the world.

We learn from and celebrate cultural diversity at the School, embracing significant international events through themed meals and other celebrations. International pupils blossom under the bespoke support they receive from dedicated staff, with each individual need, both pastoral and academic, being addressed personally and empathetically.

The varied curriculum and wide range of co-curricular activities on offer links to the universities as well as dedicated ESOL lessons and celebrations of different cultures, enabling international pupils to thrive in our diverse educational environment.

We are currently working towards becoming an MUN (Model United Nations) School.
